

# What you need to know in case you are evacuated

Please be advised that your home has been identified as being in the City of Brandon's potential evacuation area. While every measure is being taken to ensure that you will not be required to evacuate, the City of Brandon would like to provide you with a list of preparation steps should evacuating your home be necessary.

Prior to receiving a notification to evacuate your home, please have yourself, your family members and/or residents of your home pack one suit case or duffel bag with the following items (if applicable):

- Photo ID and one document containing your mailing address
- Medication for all family members
- Manitoba Health ID (MHSC) card
- Wallet & bank card
- Cell phone and charger
- Eye glasses, contacts and contact solution
- Change of clothes
- Infant and child care supplies (i.e. diapers, wipes, formula)
- Dentures

In addition, please bring the following items with you (if applicable):

- Mobility aids (i.e. wheelchair, walker, cane, hearing aids)
- Prosthetics

## **Pet owners:**

Please make plans for the care of your pet(s) for a two-week period of time. In the event that this is not possible, please be prepared to bring your pet(s) to the Manitoba Room of the Keystone Centre (Reception Centre) with you upon receiving a notice of evacuation along with the following pet-related items:

- Evacuation form obtained at the Reception Centre
- Pet food/treats
- Pet toy or comfort item (i.e. blanket)
- Pet kennel
- Proof of vaccinations:     Dogs: Rabies, distemper and parvo (bordetella is highly recommended)  
  Cats: FVR shot

## ***In the event of an evacuation order, you will be notified as follows:***

- The City of Brandon's emergency siren
- Local radio stations
- The City of Brandon website ([www.brandon.ca](http://www.brandon.ca))
- Facebook and Twitter
- In-person door-to-door visitations

## **Before leaving your home:**

- Ensure valuable items are moved to the top floor of your home
- Post the Notice of Evacuation visibly in your front window or door

## **Upon leaving your home:**

- Gather the residents of your home, the items you're bringing with you and this hand-out
- Leave your neighbourhood and if you require lodging, get to safety in the Manitoba Room of the Keystone Centre using the map on the back of this hand-out. If you have alternate lodging arrangements in place (i.e. friends or relatives), go there and call **204-729-2515** to register your household
- Follow further instructions from local officials and tune into a local radio station
- Keep all receipts for evacuation-related expenses included home flood proofing, hotel bills and meals




Police will be controlling this intersection during evacuation.
